



Outdoors Made Simple

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The good news about looking for a camper is that there are a lot of options! The bad news It can be overwhelming to find a camper that meets your needs. If you are a [member of this site](#) and you look at the travel trailer list I have, it has over 90 different models! That is a lot. The reality is most people have 1 or 2 must have items on their list and that can narrow your search significantly! I've made this check list for you to try to narrow down you list. You can then use those criteria to filter my long list into something manageable. Not a member? Find out more [here](#).

Keep in mind, my research is focused on pull behind campers (mostly travel trailers but some other types) that are less than 5000 lbs. fully loaded and less than 24 feet long. If you are open to something bigger, something drivable or a camper van, this sheet is probably still useful but I can't speak to how much any of these features will or will not limit your search.

Uncommon features: These will narrow your options down quickly so if you have something on this list as a must have, you might not be able to be as picky about the other things, I would recommend you filter your search by the feature I've listed as "rare" in the common feature column. The first 3 items – budget, weight, and camper type - are probably the most important for you to determine ahead of time.

Basic considerations:

When do you want your trailer?

- Currently, wait times for new trailers can be from a few months to a few years (really!). You may have to be flexible if you want something now.

Will you be looking for new, used or either?

- As with the new market, the used market has varied substantially with the market mostly being in favor of the seller.

How long do you think you might have this trailer?

- The reason you might think about this is that trailer quality varies. If you are planning to have this for a long time (we plan to use ours in retirement and we are a LONG ways from retirement) then you might want to spend more for higher quality. If you are planning for the next 5 years, a used model of medium quality might do just fine.
